RECRUITMENT & ONBOARDING OF FACILITATORS:

- Facilitator candidates must be graduates of the school in good standing who have been recommended by their course facilitator.
 - Facilitator trainees must go through the “Foundations for Facilitation” training materials and attend facilitator training meetings hosted by the Director of Facilitation.
 - New facilitators must sign an agreement to maintain the code of ethics and fulfill course facilitator responsibilities.

ONGOING SUPPORT & TRAINING:

- Active facilitators receive oversight, support, and regular communications from the Director of Facilitation.
- Facilitators are invited to attend global facilitator calls for ongoing training and support.
- Facilitators are provided opportunities for further training via Graduate Module courses and in-person workshops held at Transforum events and retreats.
- Facilitators are provided access to updated facilitator materials which are regularly reviewed and improved by the Gostrategic international office.
